WORKFORCE SPOTLIGHT – CROSSOVER PROGRAM SUCCESS STORY

Michele Thomas served as primary caregiver to her terminally ill husband and homeschool mother to their son for six years before the death of her husband. Her confidence level was low and her belief that she had something to offer employers was even lower. She had no source of income and needed to go back to work as quickly as possible. Staff met with Michele and through the CrossOver job readiness component she got her confidence back. She took a transition job at Food City Gas-n-Go to provide a source of income while staff assisted her with creating a professional resume and allowing her to upskill her virtual platform knowledge and QuickBooks skills. Michele had earned her bachelor's degree years ago, she



just needed to reframe her value to employers. She applied for a position with the State of Tennessee, and after 3 interviews and submitting a requested project for their evaluation she accepted a position as Internal Control Auditor. She is back in the workforce as a professional and loving it. She will graduate from the Start Smart Workforce CrossOver Program in April 2022. The CrossOver Program provides job readiness services to individuals that have been out of work for more than a year. For the last two years many job seekers have become discouraged and stagnated in trying to find a job that best suits their interest, skills, and new lifestyles after living through the COVID 19 pandemic. More people are looking for flexibility in their work schedules to better balance their career and family responsibilities. The Knoxville Area Urban League's Workforce Department has the right assessment tool for you. Youscience is a web-based career aptitude assessment that gives excellent results in measuring your natural talents and matching them to the best career options that suit your interest and skills. The Youscience assessment is a featured job seeker tool used in our Start Smart Workforce Programs. The assessment consists of 11 exercises that shows how you work, think, and understand different types of information and tasks. The Knoxville Area Urban League is an American Job Center (AJC) Access Point for individuals seeking assistance with creating a Jobs4tn account, to file an unemployment claim or to access the American Job Center services through the Virtual American Job Center Website. KAUL schedules all AJC Access Point services by appointment on either Mondays between 1:00 pm - 3:30 pm or Thursdays between 10:00 am -12:30 pm. KAUL's computer lab has computers available with internet access. Staff is available if assistance is needed. In our computer lab there is literature and materials about AJC programs and services available to the individuals including job opening announcements. Staff can assistance individuals with creating up to 5 different resumes in Jobs4tn and setting up a virtual recruiter that will notify them each time a new job posting matches their skills. COMMUNITY RESOURCES

Cherokee Health Systems Mobile Bus has partnered with the Knoxville Area Urban League to provide access to free health care. The mobile bus is scheduled to be at KAUL on April 21st, May 19th, and June 16th from 10:00 am – 3:00 pm. No appointment is required. The health services being offered are primary/acute care, rapid testing, flu vaccines, HIV and Hep C rapid testing, behavioral health services and referral services.
